

Director's Message

We're excited to announce that RPL now has over 75,000 ebooks, audiobooks, digital magazines and videos available to download and stream on your device.

First time set up of Overdrive can be done in just a short steps.

- 1. Download the Overdrive App (or if you just want to use your desktop go to the Rushville Public Library website Rushvillelibrary.com and click on eBooks).
- 2. Look up the Rushville Public Library (make sure you pick the Indiana one).
- 3. Type in your Evergreen Indiana library barcode number and your PIN number (typically the last four digits of your phone number).
- 4. Click on the star next to eIndiana Digital Consortium.
- 5. Start reading, listening, watching, streaming and downloading all those materials!






